

What Can the learners do to prevent crime in their school and community.

Learners can deter crime in their school and community by being its eyes and ears and work hand in hand with the teachers and community authorities. Learners can inform the SAPS if any criminal activity has occurred and if it happens to be at school, teachers along with the principal will be told by learners about that particular situation or offense so that the matter can be submitted to the higher authorities, of which is the SAPS, who will then come and take care of the matter by arresting the offender. We can work antagonistically with the SAPS to combat criminal activities, which will be of greater advantage.

The SAPS can come to schools and make random searches so that those who are drug dealers or offenders of the law can be removed with immediate effect. Learners can also ^{help} in road safety and prevent crime by being safe themselves. As learners we can adhere to the do's and don'ts of the road which can prevent crime from occurring. In order for learners to prevent crime in roads they can avoid distractions such as texting, putting headset, reading a book while crossing the road and looking at different directions. It is important for learners and community members to be always aware.

Learners can look for children who are not well taken care of or who live in the streets, and report them to the social workers so that they can help them financially and socially. In this way we will be avoiding the possibility of those children resorting to criminal activities in the later stage. Social workers will then take these children to the orphanage or support them by allowing them to earn grants.

When criminals are arrested they can then be taken to the National Prosecution Authority, where they can be charged for their offense. Learners and certain community members can go or be taken to the court so that they visualize for themselves why it is important to keep their hands pure. Learners will see how lawyers defend their clients and get to know more about the proceedings of the court. They will see that in court no crime is taken lightly but rather considered to be pivotal, they will also learn that it is important to use their time and opportunities efficiently and productively so they will also be encouraged to focus on making positive life choices.

As the ambassadors, we could advise the principal that learners along with the teachers should embark on a trip to the Correctional Services or to a particular jail so that they can see and learn that it is significant to keep your hands pure. The ambassadors of the program could encourage other learners by telling them about the dangers of being a crime victim or gang member, such as telling them about the harsh environments of jail. We could also advise them about the disadvantages of having a criminal record.

We as learners can start by each others rights and responsibilities so that we can become better citizens tomorrow rather than criminal offenders, such as respecting ones right to be educated without any interruption. We can also establish or distribute papers or poster posters containing the rights of individuals so that they can always be always be aware whether their rights are being violated and also be aware whether certain actions that individuals inflict on others might be or are criminal offenses, who will be then reported.
